For full-time courses

You'll need to submit your application through the University and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) www.ucas.com/apply The UCAS institution code name for Plumpton College is PLUMN and the code number P59. The deadline for UCAS applications is 15th January 2017, however we may consider late applications, if places are still available.

For part-time, CPD and postgraduate courses

You can apply direct to the college, please contact admissions@plumpton.ac.uk for further details.

Our decision

Once we've received your application, we'll consider the information you have provided. If we need to know more details then we'll be in touch, usually within 10 working days. We aim to let you know the outcome of your application within 15 working days from receipt of your application. If you're offered a place, you'll also be invited to come and look round the college and meet staff at one of our information events.

International students

If you're an international student, you're very welcome at Plumpton. We offer a range of additional support to help you successfully achieve your degree. In addition to the normal entry requirements, you'll need to have an average IELTS score of 6.5, with 6.0 in writing if English is not your first language. You will only be accepted if you have a visa which covers the length of the course.

Typical entry requirements:

- Foundation Degree: 2 A' Levels (grade D) or L3 Extended Diploma (PMM) or IB (min 26 points)
- Top up Degree: You will have completed a Foundation Degree in a relevant subject with a mean grade of 55% or above, or hold a similar qualification
- Honours Degree: 3 A Levels (grades BBC)
- Master's Degree: Upper second class honours degree (science-related subject) and WSET Level 2

Please note that some courses will have specific entry requirements – check individual course pages.

Student Support

We're here to provide you with any extra help you might need throughout your degree and your time with us at Plumpton. We've got a wide range of systems in place to support you both in your studies and regarding your personal welfare.

Counselling

Sometimes life can be challenging, particularly if you're away from home for the first time. Which is why we have a dedicated free and confidential service which is available to all students. You'll be able to talk with professional counsellors who can help you with any personal or emotional concerns that you may have.

Dyslexia and mentoring support

If you have specific learning difficulties, we're here to help. Our Student Support department will be able to advise you through the process of applying for Disabled Student's Allowance if you are not sure whether you have a learning difficulty. You'll be able to access a free Dyslexia test which will identify support you may require. Our team will also be able to refer you for assessment of any learning difficulty, medical condition or physical disability to provide the learning support you need. This could be mentoring or study skills tutoring with learning difficulty specialists, or any other specialist support.

Graduate skills development

We're focused on helping you achieve the success you desire from your course. We're proud to offer an excellent range of graduate skills tuition on either an individual or group basis. You'll gain additional skills that will help you with your studies, and for your future career too. We offer both regular and ad-hoc tuition including:

- Building an effective CV
- Exam performance/revision
- Improving your academic writing
- Presentation and interview skills
- Time management

Finance

Working out how to finance your studies can be daunting, which is why we're here to help.

How much will it cost?

Tuition fees for 2017-18 are £8000 per year for undergraduates and £5,950 for masters students. Part time students are charged a proportion of the full time fee, pro-rated in line with the intensity of study.

You'll also need to budget for accommodation and personal expenses. If you choose to live on-site, our room rates vary from £4,500 to £7000 per year, depending on the room. All our rooms are fully catered, so you'll enjoy 3 meals a day, 7 days a week. If you choose to live off-campus, individual rents can vary from upwards of £300 per month.

Financial support

If you're a UK or EU student, you can apply for a Government student loan to help towards your fees and living costs. These will vary, depending on where you live and your financial circumstances. You can get advice from the national Student Finance service.

You may also be entitled to one of our college bursaries. If you're accepted for your course, you'll be provided with details of our bursaries with your offer letter. If you find that financial difficulties could prevent you completing your studies, we also have a hardship fund you can apply to.

Part-time work

Looking to help with your funding? Part-time work can be a good option so we try to arrange the timetable to make this possible. However, we recommend that you work no more than 8 hours per week if you're studying full-time. There are some opportunities for paid part-time work here at the college – either as a student ambassador, in our college library or working at the student bar.



Careers

Our ambition is to provide you with the skills and knowledge to secure a role in the industry you've studied for; and we're very successful. Many of our graduates go on to secure management roles and places in graduate training across a wide range of land-based professions. No matter which area you choose to study, you'll gain invaluable work experience at a placement. This is your time to develop your practical skills, in addition to applying the academic theory you've studied during your course. John Manning – Forest Research, Forestry Commission

After graduating from Plumpton, John chose to continue his study at Brighton University where he received a 1st and was awarded a BSc (Hons) in Ecology. Using the skills gained over the three years of study, John's first job on graduation was as a Global Information Systems technician for Groundsure Environmental Consultants. This meant that he was able to use the skills he gained from his FdSc for this exciting role. Several years later, he moved to join the Forestry Commissions' Forest Research team. He's now responsible for landscape scale surveying of larch and sweet chestnut for the disease Pytophthora ramorum and monitoring effects of climate change on forest trees.

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Shannon Desmond – Veterinary Nurse

After graduating from Plumpton College in 2015, Shannon successfully landed full-time work at a busy first opinion small animal practice. Within six months, Shannon was promoted to 'Floor Co-ordinator', a supervisory role within the practice. This involves organising the veterinary team, and the delivery of nursing care for inpatients and outpatients. Since completing her Foundation Degree, Shannon's key interest in practice has been medical nursing. This passion was developed following Shannon's time at college, plus her invaluable experience while on placement. Her future plan is to achieve specialised qualifications within the field of Medical Nursing.

Our large sports hall at Plumpton is a great venue for a variety of sporting activities. It's also the location for our fantastic indoor climbing wall. Conveniently situated within the extensive Plumpton estate, you'll be able to enjoy all of our land-based and water activities both during your studies and enrichment activities too. You'll be able to challenge yourself and enjoy our extensive range of outdoor equipment including canoes, climbing equipment, kayaks and mountain bikes. Plumpton is also a great place for you to take part in outdoor activities such as camping, navigating and sailing.

If watersports is your passion, we have a sailing and watersports academy, run in partnership with a sailing club. The perfect opportunity for you to try out new water-based activities as well as improving your current skills, you'll be able to develop everything you need to become an instructor. Course Duration	2 years full-time or 4 years part-time

If you're looking for a Foundation Degree that will see you develop the knowledge, understanding and practical skills you'll need for employment in the outdoor adventurous sector, this course is ideal for you. Focusing on the practical aspects of outdoor education, you'll gain a valuable insight into the latest research and theory of this exciting area.

What does the course cover?

Designed to be delivered through a series of practical sessions based around theoretical approaches, you'll spend the first year looking at water and land-based activities. You'll also build a grounding in research methods which will prepare you for your studies plus other core skills. In your second year, you'll focus on specific subjects that you are particularly interested in, and also from a career perspective. You might choose to specialise in biomechanics, the outdoors and health, or sport psychology. You'll also choose an area to base a research project on.

What professional qualifications can I study?

We're renowned for having a strong reputation in the outdoor adventure industry and we understand how important it is for you to build your CV while you're studying. For this reason, you'll be encouraged to add to your studies by taking industry qualifications such as with the British Canoe Union, Mountain Leader Training Board and the Royal Yachting Association.

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Expeditions

You'll enjoy week-long residential trips in a challenging environment to develop your personal skills and give you the opportunity to use your academic theory in different practical sessions. These may be based at our excellent residential centre in North Wales. Equally, you may find yourself joining expeditions much further afield, including overseas. During your second year, you'll also get to organise and lead an expedition with other students – giving you invaluable experience to help your future career.

BA (Hons) Adventure Education Management

Course Title	BA (Hons) Adventure Education Management
Course Duration	3 years full-time or 5 years part-time

If you're looking to develop your management and leadership skills with a view to a career in the outdoor adventure education sector, this degree programme is ideal for you. Exploring the theory and practice of outdoor adventurous activities, you'll be focusing on developing creative, safe delivery and management of the educational potential of these exciting pursuits. This course is unique to Plumpton; giving you invaluable academic knowledge of this challenging sector, while giving you hands-on experience during adventures across the UK.

What does the course cover?

Studying over three years full-time, although you can also choose to study part-time, you'll get to cover a wide variety of theoretical aspects in a series of modules that cover both the adventurous activities provision and education management in the outdoor sector. You'll get to spend time enjoying mountaineering and water activities, plus a variety of other exciting adventurous activities. You'll also build your knowledge of relevant education management theory, and health and safety philosophies, procedures and legislation.

Developing a broad knowledge of the subject, you can look forward to modules that include exploring creative programme design and management, environmental sustainability, ethics and practical application of adventure media. You'll be able to tailor the programme to match your chosen career path so you could choose to study biomechanics and psychology of adventurous activity, and the impact of health and well-being agendas. You'll also be encouraged to choose an optional work placement which will give you the opportunity to experience best practice and current approaches at first hand.

What career and progression opportunities are there?

You've got loads of choices as a graduate from this course. Many graduates start as outdoor education facilitators at outdoor education centres or commercial adventure providers and look to go on to management positions. Alternatively, you can choose to take your skills further afield by leading expeditions or taking a planning and coordination role at an overseas expedition company. Other graduates have chosen to work at schools; co-ordinating outdoor education activities and managing Duke of Edinburgh schemes and trips abroad.

You could also look to move into environmental education, or working for charitable, commercial and public sector environmental education organisations. Many of our students decide to work abroad. In the past, graduates of our programmes have worked at ski resorts in Canada and the Alps, been river guides in central Africa, and worked for outdoor education companies in Australia. Or you might choose to continue your studies - to Master's degree or PhD level, or top up with a PGCE to begin your teaching career.

BA (Hons) Top-Up Outdoor Adventure Facilitation

Course Duration	1 year full-time or 2 years part-time

If you've successfully completed your Foundation Degree in Outdoor Education or an equivalent course, this programme will build on your management skills with a view to becoming an outdoor leader. You'll look into the theoretical exploration of current issues and contemporary outdoor adventure design while gaining invaluable practical experience in both land and water-based activities. You can look forward to lots of personal challenge too, as you'll enjoy week-long residentials which will give you direct experience of leading outdoor adventure activities in a variety of different environments.

What does the course cover?

This is a really flexible course. So you can choose whether to study full-time over a year, or two years part-time. You'll get to follow a programme of exciting modules which will develop your knowledge of research and recent developments in this sector. Developing your knowledge of outdoor adventure delivery; you'll enjoy interesting modules including environmental sustainability, ethics, outdoor education, programme management and psychology. You'll be able to tailor your programme to your experience and your planned career specialism. The course will also give you the opportunity to gain further skills and National Governing Body awards.

What career and progression opportunities are there?



Agriculture

One of the most important industries in the land-based sector, agricultural education is at the heart of everything we do at Plumpton. With the worlds population increasing, it is vital that progress is made to produce food sustainably.

At the core of our college farm, amongst our 800 hectare farming operation, you'll have direct access to our superb farming site which includes a large number of livestock and arable enterprises for you to experience.

Set amongst the beautiful South Downs on a variety of soil types, you will gain an excellent hands-on experience. You'll be able to use our extensive resources throughout your studies. These include a 50 cow pedigree herd of Sussex beef cattle, a 550 extensively managed breeding flock of sheep, a 120 sow pig unit, plus a modern 300 cow dairy unit complete with a 36:36 Herringbone milking parlour. We've also got a 300-hectare arable unit of mixed rotation cropping.



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FdSc Agriculture

Course Title	FdSc Agriculture
Course Duration	2 years full-time or 4 years part-time

With the world's population growing faster than ever and the need for sustainable food production increasing, agriculture is one of the most important industries in food production. If you're looking to gain a management role within this vital industry, this Foundation Degree course will give you all of the skills that you'll need to be successful.

What does the course cover?

You'll get to build a sound knowledge of agriculture through a variety of core modules. These will include beef and sheep production, business planning, crop production systems and soil science. You'll not only be in lectures, as you will also get to learn from farm visits, guest speakers, laboratory classes and practical activities. In the second year, you get to decide to specialise in an area that's of interest to you through undertaking a research project. There are also a range of optional modules on offer including conservation grazing, organic production, and practical agricultural skills.

What career and progression opportunities are there?

Once you've graduated, you'll have an extensive knowledge of agriculture which will put you in a strong position for a role in the sector and related industries. Our graduates have gone on to work within farm management plus allied industries such as agricultural sales, agronomy, animal breeding, nutrition plus government bodies such as DEFRA or the Civil Service.

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Animal Management

If you're looking to study animal science or animal behaviour and welfare, our excellent practical resources make Plumpton the ideal location for you to base your training. With our superb animal management unit, farm and fully-equipped laboratories; you've got everything you need to support your course.

We've been offering animal management courses since 1995, and it's rapidly grown to become one of our key vocational areas within the college. Major developments within the unit have included a new dog grooming unit, plus areas specialising in small mammals, birds of prey, cold and tropical aquatics, and our exotics with a wide range of amphibian, reptiles and snakes. You'll also be able to make full use of our 800-hectare farm that has a range of livestock including cows, horses, pigs and sheep.

Our modern and fully-equipped laboratories are an excellent location for animal science experiments and behaviour studies. You'll be able to use our high quality, well-maintained equipment to support your studies - such as our digital binocular compound microscopes, HPLC and electrophoresis equipment, and a PCR Thermocycler. This will enable you to learn and experience the practical elements of animal science in a safe and stimulating environment. In addition to your classwork, you'll also get to take part in research projects in areas such as biochemistry and microbiology, plus choosing your own interests to study in this fascinating subject.



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FdSc Animal Science

	2 years full-time or 4 years part-time

If you're looking to find a role in animal behaviour, animal management or the animal welfare sector, this course will provide you with the sound skills and knowledge that you'll need. Spending time at our excellent animal management unit, you'll work with a wide range of species including aquatics, companion large animals, exotics and small mammals. Plus you'll get to experience up-to-date laboratory facilities. It also places you in a good position if you should choose to go on study for an undergraduate degree. Another alternative will be for you to top up your degree to a BSc (Hons) in Animal Behaviour and Welfare, Animal Science, Biological Sciences or Ecology.

What does the course cover?

You can study this Foundation Degree over two years – although a four-year part-time option is available. Exploring core subjects such as anatomy and physiology, animal health and animal husbandry, you'll find the delivery of the course really varied too. A mixture of interesting lectures, group workshops, guest speakers, laboratory-based practicals and site visits make this a really varied course. You'll also be able to choose modules that are of particular interest to your chosen career – either behavioural, ecological or science-based. We've got a great team of staff who all have a wealth of degrees or postgraduate degrees in a variety of animal-based subject areas.

Talk to me about wildlife conservation

You've also got the exciting opportunity to take part in an optional module at the Mankwe Wildlife Reserve. A real eye-opening experience, you'll get to increase your knowledge and discover breeding, conservation, endangered species, inhabitant animals and wildlife ranching in a totally different culture. In the North West province of South Africa, 150km west of Johannesburg and 20km north of Sun City, its location of the famous South African bushveld on the boundary between the moist Eastern and dry Western regions makes it an ideal habitat for you to meet an incredible variety of wildlife. You'll be able to discover 3000 large mammals on the reserve, which is made up of 42 species plus over 250 types of bird, plus a wide variety of amphibians, invertebrates and reptiles.

Why not take part in this optional module to discover the Mankwe Wildlife Reserve in the North West province of South Africa and increase your knowledge and discover breeding, conservation, endangered species, inhabitant animals and wildlife ranching in this amazing environment.

What practical application will be involved?

You'll get to spend time in our excellent animal management unit on a weekly basis. This is a fantastic way to study all of the different species in detail; gaining a wide understanding of their health, nutritional and husbandry needs. A fantastic way to apply your knowledge that you've gained during your lectures in a practical situation. You'll be able to see what works by observing the animals' behaviour and evaluating the outcome of animal interactions.

Course Title	BSc (Hons) Animal Science
	3 years full-time or 5 years part-time

If you're looking to work with animals or progress into animal research, this will be a really interesting course for you. You'll discover an in-depth knowledge of animal science, conservation, genetics, health and welfare issues. With extensive practical experience to be gained, this thought-provoking course is designed to give you critical understanding of a range of academic and transferable skills related to animal science.

What does the course cover?

Taken over three years full-time, with part-time options available, you'll have the opportunity to discover key subjects that introduce core scientific principles such as anatomy and physiology, cell biology, molecular biology and nutrition. You'll be encouraged to think independently; critically reviewing published work and carrying out fascinating research at the bench – both in the field and academically. You'll enjoy a great mixed programme of animal handling, conferences, field trips, laboratory investigations, projects and seminars. In your second and third years, you'll get to challenge yourself through the completion of a research project that's of interest to you.

What career and progression opportunities are there?

You'll have two work placement opportunities which will give you the chance to spend an extended period of time working in an organisation that complements your studies. You'll get to work alongside professionals; completing tasks and taking on responsibility within a work-related context. It also boosts your chances of future employment being offered. You may choose to spend your work experience at rescue and rehabilitation centres or zoological parks.

What research is involved?

Working under the supervision of a member of academic staff, you'll get to design an original research project. You can choose whether to work closely with animals – either companion, exotic, farm livestock or wild species. Alternatively, you could choose to work in our well-equipped laboratory using our excellent resources. Animal Management

You'll be allocated a work placement practice in your first year – most students will stay with the same practice throughout their training. This is an opportunity for you to become fully integrated within a multidisciplinary team. Additional entry requirements

You'll need at least 5 GCSEs (minimum grade C) including English Language, Maths and a Science plus either:

- A Levels to include at least one science, preferably Biology (Grade C)
- Advanced GNVQ or BTEC Extended Diploma in a relevant subject (MMP)
- Level 3 Key Skills, but not General Studies

If you're a mature student who has appropriate GCSEs but not A Levels or an Extended Diploma, you may be eligible for entry if you have a Level 3 sciencebased qualification. A QAA-approved Access to Science course is also acceptable.

You will also need to have completed at least four weeks' work experience in an animal-related industry. A minimum of two weeks should be in a veterinary practice working as a Student Veterinary Nurse – four weeks is preferred.

In addition to our academic entry criteria, you'll need to demonstrate your fitness to practice according to RCVS guidelines. You'll be required to disclose any convictions, including drugs offences, before you start your course. The RCVS may, depending on the offence, refuse to allow professional registration on graduation.

Covering a practical and theoretical understanding of wine and the wine industry, it's an excellent combination of lectures, practical wine tasting, work experience, an independent project and the opportunity to visit European vineyards. You'll explore the wine trade; focusing on business planning, development and marketing, plus modules that link to the Wine and Spirit Education Trust (WSET) Level 3 and Level 4 qualifications. You'll also have the opportunity to study for your WSET Diploma as an additional qualification (the cost of exam entry is additional to fees).

What does the course cover?

You'll gain a strong academic framework for business management in the wine industry. In your first year, you'll cover food and wine matching, principles of grape-growing and winemaking, and business modules including data management, finance, marketing, an overview of the wine trade, and people management. In your second year you'll get to study the world's key still, sparkling and fortified wine-producing regions in greater depth. This will be backed up with business-related modules including wine communications, wine marketing and strategy, and wine sales. You'll also complete compulsory project and work placement modules.

What career and progression opportunities are there?

With the UK being seen as the most dynamic of world wine markets, UK wine qualifications are certainly held in high regard. You'll have many opportunities to network directly in the wine industry throughout your course – opening up job opportunities for you after graduation. Many of our successful graduates have gone on to very rewarding careers: business development manager, global wine buyer, independent retailer or sommelier. You can also choose to continue your studies and top up to your BA (Hons) Wine Business qualification.

If you're looking to gain a high-level career in the wine trade, this unique course will develop a strong framework for business management in this exciting industry. Normally studied over three academic years, you can also choose to complete it on a part-time basis.

What does the course cover?

You'll cover three academic strands in this fascinating course programme: general business management, the wine trade and wines of the world. You'll get to cover interesting modules including contemporary issues in alcohol, new beverage development and launch, wine classification and wine distribution channels. On the business side, you'll study economics and data management, finance, marketing and people management. In the wines of the world modules, you'll have the chance to undertake in-depth research into the world's key still, sparkling and fortified wine regions.

What about industry links?

Being so close to London, one of the world's key marketplaces for wine provides a great opportunity for keeping up to speed with the latest developments in the wine trade. Unique to the UK, you'll gain key management, scientific and technical skills you'll need to become a professional vinegrower and winemaker on this excellent course. With a strong practical emphasis, you'll be very much involved in the production of the college's award-winning wine in our well-equipped commercial vineyards and winery.

What does the course cover?

In your first year, you'll focus on vinegrowing, with modules such as grapevine biology, vineyard establishment and maintenance, and vineyard practical skills. In your second semester, you'll enjoy spending a day a week in the vineyard, gaining practical experience in tasks such tractor driving, trellis repairs, and winter pruning. Your first year will also give you the chance to discover the foundations of winemaking, with modules in chemistry, grape processing, and wine analysis. In your second year, you'll focus on winemaking, working in the College winery for the harvest. You can look forward to completing a work placement in industry plus a research project, in addition to optional modules in business and wine science. If you get sufficiently high grades in key modules, you'll be invited to transfer to the BSc (Hons) Viticulture & Oenology at the end of your first or second year.

If you're looking to explore the science of grape growing and winemaking, and gain the knowledge and skills to pursue a career in wine production, this is the perfect course for you. Unique to Plumpton College, you will be offered a world-class education in wine - based in Europe and delivered in English.

What does the course cover?

Normally studied full-time over three academic years, you can also choose to study part-time. You'll get to actively participate in the maintenance of our 10-hectare vineyards and in the production of our award-winning wine. During your course, you'll cover all aspects of wine production and related biological sciences, including practical vinegrowing and winemaking, viticulture and oenology theory, wine sensory evaluation and wine analysis. In your final stage of your degree, you'll also get to carry out an independent research project.

What placement is involved?

In order to develop your winemaking skills and gain a deeper understanding of the factors that affect the quality of wine production, you'll get to select a placement in a commercial winery for the vintage period in your final year of study. MSc Viticulture and Oenology

Course Duration	1 year full-time (14 months) or 2 years part-time (26 months)	

This challenging programme is designed to enable you to develop a deep and systematic understanding of wine science and related disciplines, with a view to applying this knowledge to make complex viticultural and oenological decisions. The course covers key areas such as sparkling wine production, climate change, and sustainability. You'll have opportunities to visit other wine-producing areas in Europe throughout your course. Supported by our friendly wine department staff, you'll be able to benefit from their considerable international expertise and research experience in addition to our outstanding wine centre facilities; enabling you to access an outstanding master's level education.

What does the course cover?

At the beginning of your course, you'll be required to attend a two-week intensive course in vinegrowing and winemaking. During your first semester, you'll study three modules which will enable you to gain and apply your knowledge and understanding of current research in biochemistry, grapevine physiology, microbiology and wine chemistry. The second semester will focus on climate, sparkling wine and sustainability. If you're looking to complete your postgraduate diploma in viticulture and oenology, you can choose to write an independent study and end your studies at this point. Alternatively, if you'd like to study for your full master's degree, you'll normally take an indepth research methods module before starting your master's project. During your third semester, you'll complete your master's project, which can be taken either in the UK Wine Research Centre, or in another suitable location.

What study trips are there?

In your second semester, you'll have the exciting opportunity to visit a classic European wine region as part of the two compulsory modules in the programme. You'll also have the chance to join study tours organised by Plumpton College which have previously included Bordeaux, Montpellier, Dijon, North-East Italy, Barcelona and the Mosel Valley.

Talk to me about research

In your final semester, you'll be able to take part in an in-depth investigative research project into a specialist topic in viticulture and oenology. You'll have the possibility to conduct these projects in partnership with industry and in other European countries; providing you with a broad range of real-life professional experience.

What career and progression opportunities are there?

This course gives you the opportunity to develop advanced skills in vinegrowing and winemaking; making you highly employable in senior roles requiring a high technical knowledge and considerable degree of responsibility. Ideally, this qualification will enable you to apply the knowledge and understanding gained through your previous qualification, within a wine industry context, at a high level. You could go on to choose a role as a vineyard manager, viticultural consultant, winemaker or winemaking consultant either in the wine trade, or wine production, anywhere in the world where wine is produced or sold. Alternatively, you may choose to continue your studies to achieve a PhD qualification in a related subject.


