

Our Agriculture provision has been a hub of activity this academic year as Level 3 Agriculture students were given the task of creating a 360 virtual reality video. Used to teach Level 1 and 2 Agriculture students best practice when milking the dairy herd; preparing the herd for milking, and showing why certain processes are undertaken to maintain the health and welfare of the herd.

Third year students enjoyed a five-day study trip to the Paris International Agricultural Show. This trip gives an insight to farming differences in another country both cropping and stocking compared to the UK. The show has a vast amount of new and developing technology that supports an innovative approach within agriculture which is an essential approach in the drive for quality food production and efficiency.

Represent the college as part of the Show Team. The team enter cattle, pigs and sheep into a variety of country shows throughout the academic year and frequently return to college with an abundance of rosettes.

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ANIMAN MANAGEMENT

If you're interested in animals, there's a world of opportunities to explore, from animal behaviourist to zoo keeper, animal welfare officer to ecologist, or lab technician to conservation leader. We have a fantastic Animal Management Centre for you to discover with areas specialising in small mammals, birds of prey, cold and tropical aquatics, and our exotics with a wide range of amphibians, reptiles and snakes.





You'll work with a variety of animals as a basis, preparing you for work experience and moving into relevant employment. You will learn essential skills required to work within the animal care industry such as how to feed and water animals, maintain their accommodation, handling animals and carrying out animal health checks. You can also progress onto the Animal Management degree programmes, also offered at Plumpton College.



The trips last around two weeks and are great for students gaining on the ground experience with exotic animals.

Our Animal Management students also benefit highly from expert seminars held at the college by top professors from across the globe who focus on topics such as dolphin welfare, exotic habitats and animal behaviour.

Engineering is a growing industry, with a 6% growth in enterprises in the UK and 19% of the UK total workforce being employed within this diverse sector (Engineering UK, 2018). At Plumpton we have a dedicated Engineering department including Blacksmithing and Metalwork, Land-based Engineering and Motor Vehicle courses.



BLACKSMITHING & METALSMITHING

Delve into the creative and diverse world of metalwork, where you can learn the traditional skills of forging and fabrication to create designs of your own. This industry is very much in demand, from heavy forge work to fine jewellery and small scale metal work. Your course could include:



What do you love most about Plumpton College?


I believe a job is what you make of it, but people make a place. I am fortunate to work with some of the most dedicated, supportive and knowledgeable people and I feel inspired by them every day.

Become responsible for maintaining high quality customer service, preparing and selling fish and enjoy sessions from Chief Executive, of Billingsgate Seafood School.

The winner by a very narrow margin was Nicola Thomas, who produced a new take on pretzels with a twisted combination of a peanut dough and a dark chocolate dough. She marketed this a "Twistzel" and also constructed a stand for her pretzels to be displayed. The winning product was then displayed and sold in Real Patisserie and a fellow well known bakery.

Our very own Butchery Apprenticeship Students have won Institute of Meat 'National Apprentice of the Year' awards for three out of the last four years.

What did you love most about studying at Plumpton College and how has it changed you?





FORESTRY 8 ARBORICULTURE

Climb your way to a top career within this diverse and growing sector that can offer a range of pathways, from forestry and woodland operations to arboriculture all brought together by a passion for trees, ecology and the outdoors.

The processing sector is highly advanced and at the forefront of technological innovation. In addition to wood grown in the UK, wood is sourced and processed from many other countries, including Scandinavia, Europe, North America, South America, Africa and the Far East.





Trees also serve an important purpose in our environment with forests and woodlands making up 13% of the land cover in the UK and therefore there are many roles available in conservation and preservation such as a tree officer or tree surveyor. If you are thinking of becoming self-employed or contracting for a large organisation there are plenty of opportunities including grounds worker, climber and utility arborist.

We have both full time study programmes and apprenticeships to suit your level of knowledge and experience.

Your course could include:

- Plant and soil science
- Tree planting, identification, and care
- Work experience
- Tree felling and chainsaw use
- Forest and woodland skills
- Specialist forestry and arboricultural machinery
- Arboriculture skills
- Pests and diseases
- Tree surveys, inspections and data analysis

Plumpton College's Level 3 Forestry students competed in the annual 3ATC Southern College Climbing competition run by the Arb Association. The Plumpton College students climbed their way to victory, with second-year students claiming first place and the first years taking second in their respective year groups. Plumpton College has entered teams into the 3ATC competitions for the last seven years, the experience has proven to be invaluable for our students, giving them experience outside of college as well as ample networking opportunities.

FOUNDATION L'EARNING

Get the best possible start to your career with our Foundation Learning Pathway courses. It's a great stepping stone into college and further education. The course will develop your independence and confidence, preparing you for further study and progression into work best suited to your skills and experience. We have a dedicated Foundation Learning building to provide an environment where you can thrive.



PATHWAY TO INDEPENDENCE AND PERSONAL PROGRESS (ENTRY 2)

You will learn and practice your independence skills, which will help prepare you for adulthood. This will include social communication, team work and enterprise projects. You will be developing key skills to help you decide and shape your future path. You will achieve an Entry 2 qualification, continue with English and maths, undertake a variety of projects including art, photography, the Jim Green Competition and take part in 1:1 and group tutorials. This course can be taken over two years.

PATHWAY TO PROGRESSION (ENTRY 3)

This course is all about progression onto either employment or further study. You'll be ready for the challenge of finding out more about work-related learning. This course is designed to help you choose your future path and you will get the chance to experience other vocations and undertake group work placements. You will achieve an Entry 3 qualification, continue with English and maths, undertake a variety of projects including enterprise, horticulture, Jim Green Competition, group work experience and take part in 1:1 and group tutorials. This will help you to decide what your next steps will be. This course can be taken over two years.

STEPPING INTO WORK (LEVEL 1)

You will develop the required skills and experience to be ready for work, or if you require support getting a job, for the Supported Internship programme. You will achieve a Level 1 qualification, continue with English and maths, undertake an individual work placement and take part in 1:1 and group tutorials. The course is the stepping stone into employment, an apprenticeship or the Supported Internship programme where you are supported to find paid work.

STEPPING INTO COLLEGE (LEVEL 1)

This course is for you if you are not quite ready to undertake a vocational course and may need a more supported introduction to college and the expectation of college life. You will achieve a Level 1 qualification, continue with English and maths and take part in 1:1 and group tutorials. This course will include study skills, use of college facilities and systems and becoming familiar with the site and meeting staff. You will have the chance to experience a vocational area of your choice and develop your personal and social skills ready to fully integrate into college life.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP (LEVEL 1)

For 18+ students, a Supported Internship may be the perfect course for you. Supported Internships are a one year study programme with the core aim being to find paid, sustainable work for young adults with SEND. Supported Internships focus on developing a young person's independence; every student will be offered a work placement within a business where there is the likelihood of paid work becoming available. You will achieve a Level 1 qualification, continue with English and maths (if needed), undertake individual work placements and take part in 1:1 and group tutorials. You'll have support from a job coach and regular reviews to make sure you get the most from your experience.


HIGHLIGHTS

Students have successfully progressed onto vocational courses including equine, animal care, floristry, motor vehicle and horticulture.

The students take part in a range of enrichment activities including beach cleans, horticulture enterprise, Disability Cricket and the Jim Green Competition. Floristry is definitely one of the most creative areas of the land-based sector and through our fantastic courses, you'll gain the ability to produce stunning floral creations for many special occasions. We've got fantastic facilities here at Plumpton College with a natural environment certain to inspire you.





Whether it is wedding or funeral flowers, birthdays or other special occasions, florists are responsible for the beautiful creations from different flowers and natural foliage. There's a wide level of study to choose from, whether you are new to the industry or looking to train as a master florist, including full and part time options to suit you.

With 800 hectares of campus at your feet and the South Downs as your backdrop, there is no better place to further your studies of the countryside.

Our outdoor spaces are becoming popular destinations for recreation and rural tourism, and as our climate changes, there is an increased demand for skilled people who can ensure that habitats are protected while making sure that the public still have the chance to enjoy its beauty.

Our course options include Environmental Studies and Conservation, Game and Wildlife Management and Fisheries and Aquatic Science.



ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES & CONSERVATION

The modern countryside and conservation industry faces a range of complex issues. Tourism and countryside development are essential to rural economies and you will study how these can best support strong conservation principles to promote better biodiversity and healthy ecosystems. You'll gain a fantastic understanding of scientific and habitat-specific principles alongside the practical skills that will enable you to put them into place.

Your course could include:

- Conservation of British habitats
- Estate skills
- Species identification and surveying
- Land and countryside use
- Principles of wildlife ecology and conservation
- Countryside recreation

HIGHLIGHTS

Students learning incorporates all of our major local habitats such as the South Downs National Park, Ashdown Forest and local National Trust and Wildlife Trust locations. In addition, trips behind the scenes to the Millennium Seed Bank and the Natural History Museum support the development of scientific skills. Field trips further afield to our centre in Snowdonia encourage students to apply their knowledge to broader horizons.

GAME & WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

With careers ranging from Gun Dog Trainer to Countryside Ranger or Estate Manager, this is a diverse industry with a range of opportunities to suit everyone. This course teaches you about the sensitive management of woodland and countryside habitats, developing your knowledge of estate management. We have several blocks of woodland used to rear game birds, look at woodland ecology and for the college shoot. You will carry out varied practical tasks related to gamekeeping on the college estate, supplemented by visits to various estates across the South East.

Your course could include:

- Conservation and improvement of British habitats
- Firearm safety
- Estate skills
- Pest and predator control
- Machinery operations
- Game management
- Maintenance of game and deer populations
- Assist with shooting activities at the college

14+ STUDY PROGRAMMES

We run programmes for students who are 14-16, school Year 10 and 11, still studying at school, or are Electively Home Educated. School students can come to college and study for a vocational qualification, 1 day a week for either 1 or 2 years. The vocational programme is for a single day per week but we are happy to work with the student and school to arrange a bespoke offer. The student will need agreement from the school to study here and the application form needs to be signed by your parents and school. This is a great stepping stone into a full time programme and to provide a qualification and range of skills that might not be on offer at school.

Electively Home Educated students can choose a vocational programme like school students but also add additional days for functional skills or GCSEs in English and maths and Level 1 courses in Applied Science and PSHE (Personal, Social Development). The offer can be 1 to 3 days and courses are offered at our Plumpton campus.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

If you're interested in developing your personal, social, academic and employability skills as well as English and maths, then our Foundation Learning Pathway programmes are ideal for you.

You will work towards a City & Guilds or BTEC qualification, and cover topics which include exploring art, developing ICT skills, keeping safe, developing self-awareness and communication. You will also get to develop practical skills through vocational tasters and go on visits and outings. Work experience is also a big part of your course, helping to build on your interests, experience and confidence, as well as provide opportunities to engage in real life practical work-related activities.

The Foundation Learning Pathway programmes include an offer at Entry Level 2, Entry Level 3 and Level 1 and can be taken over one to three years, depending on your needs. We also offer a Supported Internship programme which is undertaken as a final year of study to learners with an EHCP who require support to progress into work. This is a one year programme.

QUALIFICATION FOR YOU

FULL TIME STUDY PROGRAMMES

Our full-time vocational programmes are accredited by a range of different awarding organisations, including Pearson Edexcel, City & Guilds and Gateway.

All of the courses that can be studied at Plumpton, enable students to achieve technical qualifications, which means that students develop industry knowledge, skills and competences alongside a programme of academic study.

All of the courses are assessed via coursework, and many now also include written exams and other time constrained assessments.

QUALIFICATION LEVELS

Entry Level: If you have no prior experience and you don't feel confident about your abilities, then this level could be a good place to start. You do not need any qualifications but you will need to show a willingness to learn.

Level 1: Ideal if you are just starting out or are new to the subject area. This level covers routine tasks and basic knowledge.

Level 2: This is a great way to improve your knowledge of a subject area and will be the equivalent of GCSE level of study.

Level 3: You can either study for 1 or 2 years or attain either an equivalent to 1 full A Level or the equivalent of 3 A Levels. Ideal if you would like to go on to study at a higher level such as University.

QUALIFICATION FOR YOU

APPRENTICESHIPS

WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is a real job that combines hands on work with the opportunity to train and develop your skills, knowledge and behaviours in your chosen profession. As an apprentice you'll usually be employed to work a minimum 30hrs per week and be paid a wage no less than the current national minimum wage for the time you are in work and training.

At least 20% of your paid time will be spent in training and development, usually with us at college but may also take place online or in your workplace. The rest of your time will be spent applying your skills and knowledge in your workplace, doing the job you have been employed to do. By the end of your apprenticeship, you'll have gained the skills and knowledge needed to either succeed in your chosen career or progress onto the next apprenticeship level.

Apprenticeships are open to anyone who is 16 years old and over, has a right to work in England and is not in full time education. There is no upper age limit and available to anyone whether starting out in their career or for those who have been working for some time. Modern apprenticeships can now support your learning aspirations to the highest level however it is important to know that the level is based on the job role and duties it is attached to. This means that even though you may have a higher-level qualification in other subjects you could still undertake an apprenticeship at a lower level.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIPS

WHAT IS A SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP?

Supported Internships are one year study programmes run by Plumpton College, with the core aim to find paid, sustainable work for young adults with SEND.

This is a real hands-on course where you'll spend at least one day a week in a working business, and the rest of your time either in college or working out in the community on a range of real-life projects. It's a brilliant opportunity for you to develop practical skills, you'll get to develop your existing skills and transfer them from the college environment to the workplace.

You'll be encouraged to look at the barriers that are preventing you from working independently, all with an end goal of finding a job to suit your aspirations.

You'll need to be 18 - 23 with an Education, Health and Care plan and be in your final year of college.

Alternatively if you do not have an Education, Health and Care plan, we can offer you a Supported Traineeship.

HIGHER EDUCATION

Our degree courses are validated in partnership with the Royal Agricultural University in Cirencester. Together we provide expert teaching, an inspirational campus and a rich student experience to ensure that our graduates leave us with the right knowledge, skills and attributes to pursue successful careers in the land-based sector. We offer degrees in Equine Science and Coaching, Veterinary Nursing, Animal Behaviour and Conservation and both Wine Production and Wine Business. You can choose to study either full-time or part-time, whichever works best for you. Studying with us at level 3 provides the perfect opportunity to progress onto one of our popular degree courses. We offer students studying at level 3 specialist sessions and events throughout the year to help prepare for this next exciting step.

ENGLISH & MATHS

STUDYING FOR ENGLISH AND MATHS

We know that employers are looking for students with good English and maths skills and as it is our goal to help you be as employable as possible we will work with you to improve your skills during your time here. We have a fabulous team of expert staff who have supported students over the last two years to exceed national averages in achieving their grade 4 and above in English and maths.

This is why we include English and mathematics results as part of our entry criteria for our study programmes, as all students who haven't yet achieved a grade 4 or above in their English or maths will continue to study it with us, either at GCSE or Functional skills.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Study programmes include a minimum of compulsory work experience hours achieved through one day a week or block placements. The amount of hours required is dependent on the study programme.

INDUSTRY WORK PLACEMENT

All students aged 16-18 on our Level 2 and Level 3 programmes are encouraged to take part in an exciting 50-day industry placement programme alongside completion of their vocational course. The programme will give you the chance to gain valuable skills in a real working environment whilst being paired with your ideal employer.

Our mission is to pair students with their ideal employer and to support them continuously during the placement.

There is flexibility on how students complete the placement; it can be during non-college weekdays, weekends, in blocks or over the holiday period. - You'll need to ensure that you have the chance to attend college during work hours as part of your paid employment. If you are not yet in employment we can help find you an employer within the subject field of your apprenticeship.
- You will ideally have achieved GCSEs grades 9-2 or A-E or equivalent*. If you have an equivalent qualification, we will also take this into consideration, along with any industry experience that you may have.
- You'll need to attend an interview and complete an initial assessment.
 This is to help us understand what level you are currently working at, and to make sure that we arrange the right level programme to suit your individual needs.

If you're 16-18 or over 19 in your first apprenticeship year, the minimum apprenticeship wage is £4.15" an hour.

However, if you're 19 or older and in further years of your apprenticeship, you'll receive the National Minimum Wage.

BURSARIES

We have a wide range of bursary funds that are given on a discretionary basis to provide financial assistance to eligible students who without support would not have access to learning. The threshold household income for a discretionary bursary is £27,000. We also consider applications for residential bursaries to help with your costs of our on-site accommodation, if you're in a household with an income below £34,000 you can apply. We consider applications for support on an individual basis.

We advise early application for financial support as these funds are limited. You can apply via our website.

MATERIALS & CONSUMABLE FEES

Where courses require material/ consumables which are essential to complete your study, this will be included in the price of your course fees or, if your course is fully funded, this will be included in the funding.

However, in some cases the college makes an extra compulsory equipment/ consumable charge when the student has the opportunity during the course to take work projects away. This will apply to all students, regardless of their fee assessment.

A list of equipment and materials will be provided to you prior to your enrolment. These can be purchased through the college's discounted suppliers if you wish, or you can bring your own materials.

PAYMENT PLANS

We offer deferred payment schemes, where you can pay fees in equal instalments during the academic year. To find out if this applies to you please contact finance@plumpton.ac.uk or call 01273 890454. ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS

The loan system is similar to that currently operated within Higher Education by the Student Loans Company. Loans are not means tested and there is no credit check. Repayments do not start until you're earning over £27,000. To be eligible you must be:

- Studying a qualifying Level 3 or 4 course (Such as Access to HE courses, Diploma and Certificate courses)
- A resident in the UK for the past 3 years
