- 2. Your new account should be dedicated to your course, please **do not** use this as a personal account it should only be used for Equine related content and opinions. Think of how you present yourself on social media as this can (*and has in the past*) impact on opportunities in the future.
- 3. You must follow the Equine course Instagram account so we are able to set the weekly tasks and monitor your progress by 'tagging us' in your post.
- 4. Be respectful. Only use the DM function (Direct messaging) to get know your new classmates. Be positive, professional but most importantly... **Pleasant!**
