The below activities have been designed to keep you up to date with latest developments in Floristry and come to college in September with some ideas and information to share with your new classmates and lecturers.

We do not require that you produce much physical work but we encourage you to keep some notes, perhaps a diary and where relevant take some photographs on your phone as a way of retaining what you have learnt.

Date to be completed	Task	How long to spend on it?
Week Commencing 1 June 2020	A Day in the life of a Florist – Watch this short video: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yPQoWa_ilSI&t=18s Think of the duties that a Florist may do in a working day.	It takes 10 minutes
Week Commencing 15 June 2020	Discover Colour – Using your phone take a photo of anything that resembles each colour on the colour wheel – it could be a flower or an object. 	As little or as much time as you want.
Week Commencing 22 June 2020	Watch a short video about the New Covent Garden Flower Market. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EQNCmcvoQo4 Can you remember how many wholesalers there are and what they sell at the market?	It takes about 7 minutes
Week Commencing 29 June 2020	Make a list of your favourite flowers and on a walk take some photos of flowers you recognise and try to identify them. To help identify them you may like to download an app such as 'Flower Book' or 'Garden Answers'.	As little or as much time as you want.
Week Commencing 6 July 2020	The language and meaning of flowers - ask your friends or family what their favourite flower is and tell them the meaning of it. What is yours? Look at this website for inspiration http://thelanguageofflowers.com/	As little or as much time as you want.
Week Commencing 13 July 2020	On Trend with Plants - this week pay attention to houseplants, look around and notice them in your surroundings, on TV or social media. What are your favourite plants and why? How would you care for them? Can you create a plant mood board; you can do this on a Pinterest board or make a collage with magazine clippings.	As little or as much time as you want.
