Job Purpose

To cover maternity leave and contributing to a dynamic and dedicated team at Plumpton College, delivering high-quality education to the next generation of leading winemakers and viticulturists who will lead the industry nationally and internationally in the future. By delivering highly effective teaching, learning and assessment and support students in reaching their full potential and to achieve timely success and progress toward further study or employment. The ideal candidate will be able to demonstrate a profound knowledge of wine components, wine chemistry, wine production, wine analysis, and quantitative and qualitative statistics.

Duties and responsibilities of the job

1. Teaching, Learning and Assessment

- a. As directed by the line manager and the Director of Wine, plan, prepare, teach, assess, report and monitor to ensure each highly effective lesson to a consistently good standard.
- b. Conduct initial assessments and record within the Student Individual Learning Plan, adapt teaching delivery to meet the requirements of the plan and monitor student progress frequently and report to Programme Manager.
- c. Work to ensure high levels of student attendance in all sessions and prompt completion of registers.
- d. Effectively use schemes of work and lesson plans in line with college processes.
- e. Use and apply modern technology in TLA to enhance the learning experience and support progress for students, e.g., specialist software/resources, working to the college VLE standards.
- f. Ensure cohesive assessment plans are in place for all students across your allocated teaching to ensure effective student progress.

- g. Set exams, homework and extension activities for individual students and provide timely, and constructive feedback to students to support progress.
- h. Mark and assess course work and provide effective verbal and/or written feedback to support progression in line with awarding organisation requirements and college processes.
- i. Monitor tracking of individual student progress across programme(s) and ensure action is taken to improve progress where possible.

2. Quality Improvement

- a. Attend team meetings to monitor and standardise practice, share information and good practice, and plan and implement improvements.

- g. In liaison with line manager and the Director of Wine r, undertake the role of IV as required.
- h. Contribute to the Programme Team Review, including a Quality Improvement Plan for the programme(s) allocated.
- i. Contribute to the programme development by providing subject specialist information.

3. Continuous Professional Development

- a. Participate in staff development activities to support Continuous Professional Development (CPD) and keep a Professional Development Portfolio (PDP) to evidence personal development and impact on practice.
- b. Actively participate in the College performance management processes, including appraisals to support personal and professional development and enhance student experience.
- c. Complete all mandatory training as required in line with college expectations.

4. Other responsibilities and duties

- d. Participate in staff and student recruitment campaigns, interviews, Open Days and promotional/information events.
- e. Work with employers and other stakeholders as required to develop and deliver high quality curriculum.
- f. Comply with the departmental operating plan and contribute to action plans as needed.
- g. Ensure all safeguarding policies and procedures are followed.
- h. Any other duties connected with the post as are reasonably required from time to time.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

Teaching

This is a teaching post, and the total number of teaching hours undertaken will depend on the nature of the teaching (practical / theory) and the size of classes and any other allocated responsibilities.

Working Hours

Basic working hours are from 08.30 to 17.00 Monday to Friday, but some flexibility will be required to meet the needs of the business. This is an all-year-round post. There will be some evening and weekend working required to support faculty activities, and whole college recruitment and promotional events. There are opportunities for part-time / flexible hours so actual hours will be agreed with the successful candidate.

Annual Leave

The holiday year is from 1 September - 31 August each year. The annual leave entitlement for this role is 37 working days, 8 bank holidays and efficiency days as stipulated by the Senior Management Team. Annual leave is subject to operational requirements and should be planned and approved by your line manager. Annual leave must be booked on our online HR and Payroll system.

Continuous Professional Development (CPD)

This post will be entitled to CPD for industrial updating, personal and professional development. All CPD must be planned, approved, and scheduled with your line manager.

Benefits

The candidate appointed to the post will automatically become a member of the Teachers' Pension Scheme (TPS) and pay contributions as determined by annual salary levels. The pension scheme includes life assurance cover, and the College will also pay a contribution towards your pension. Criminal Record Check via the Disclosure Procedure
