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KERRIS POLAND ASSISTANT TRAINEE AGRONOMIST 'The first year of the agriculture programme is really learning about all the aspects of agriculture and the industry itself. The second year is a 'sandwich' year, which I spent at Great Omenden Farm with Hans Van Den Boomen. I learned a lot of new skills from re-seeding, silaging, calf rearing, milking and tractor work. I attained my spraying certificates and became really passionate about agronomy. Once I returned to college for my final year, I specialised in arable, crop production, machinery and workshop skills.

My work now as a trainee Agronomist involves trialling new products, such as a pesticide. I trial products on various crops for it to be approved for use, which will then be released to the open market. We go out into the field, follow the study plan from the client and carry out assessments and applications such a fungicide trial and collect the data. The company has bases all over the world so there are great opportunities to swap with team members in other countries to get experience in another area. With hard work, determination and people helping you along the way, you can achieve anything you desire.'


SAILING ACADEMY

14+ STUDY PROGRAMMES

We run programmes for students who are still studying at school, or are home educated, where you can come to college to study for a qualification 1 day per week. If you are at school, you will need to talk to your teacher or tutor about applying and have your application form signed by your parents and school. This is a great stepping stone into a full time programme. You can also add an additional day for functional skills or GCSE in English, Maths and Applied Science.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

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If you're interested in developing your personal, social, academic and employability skills as well as English and mathematics, then our entry level Rural Pathways programme is ideal for you.

You will work towards a number of units which include exploring art, developing ICT skills, keeping safe, developing self-awareness and communication. You will also get to develop practical skills through

vocational tasters and go on visits and outings. Work experience is also a big part of your course, helping to build on your interests, experience and confidence, as well as provide opportunities to engage in real life practical work-related activities. The Rural Pathways study programmes range from Entry level 1 to Entry level 3 and between one to three years, depending on your needs.

FULL TIME STUDY PROGRAMMES

Our full-time vocational programmes are accredited by Pearson BTEC and City and Guilds.

OUR AWARDING BODIES EXPLAINED

National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs), City and Guilds qualifications and diplomas are examples of 'vocational' or work-based' qualifications that teach students the skills and knowledge they need for a chosen occupation. Level 1, 2 and 3 optional are available for most courses as are opportunities to progress onto degree level qualifications. BTEC stands for the Business and Technology Education Council and are a specialist work-related qualification. They combine practical learning with subject and theory content.

During a vocational course, a student will be assessed on their practical and a<u>cade</u>mic skills.

QUALIFICATION LEVELS

Entry Level: If you have no prior experience and you don't feel confident about your abilities, then this level could be a good place to start. You do not need any qualifications but you will need to show a willingness to learn

Level 1: Ideal if you are just starting out or are new to the subject area. This level covers routine tasks and basic knowledge.

Level 2: This is a great way to improve your knowledge of a subject area and will be the equivalent of GCSE level of study.

Level 3: Covers more complex work and will help you develop your skills. Ideal if you would like to go on to study at a higher level such as University. You can either study for 1 or 2 years or attain either an equivalent to one full A Level or the equivalent of 3 A Levels. 'Students develop very good practical and vocational skills and produce work of a high standard...the proportion of learners who achieve their qualifications has increased over the past three years...and the proportion of learners who achieve A* – C grades in GCSE English and mathematics in 2016/17 improved considerably and was higher than recent national rates.'

APPRENTICESHIPS

WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

Apprenticeships allow you to combine work and study by mixing on-the-job training with classroom learning. You'll be employed to do a real job while studying for a formal qualification, usually for one day a week either at a college or at your place of work. By the end of your apprenticeship, you'll have gained the skills and knowledge needed to either succeed in your chosen career or progress onto the next apprenticeship level.

What you'll learn depends on the role that you're training for. However, apprentices in every role follow an approved study programme, which means you'll gain a nationallyrecognised qualification at the end of your apprenticeship.

The college currently offers two different levels of apprenticeship:

Level 2 (Intermediate): Equivalent to five good GCSE passes.

Level 3 (Advanced): Equivalent to two A-level passes.

TRAINEESHIP

WHAT IS A TRAINEESHIP?

A traineeship is a great place to start if you are not quite ready for an apprenticeship, but want to become work-ready. It incorporates work experience and prepares you for your future career. Designed for people aged 16-24 who don't yet have the appropriate skills or experience, traineeships provide the essential work preparation training, English, maths and work experience needed to secure an apprenticeship or employment.

A traineeship has three core elements:

- A high-quality work experience placement with an employer.
- Work preparation training, provided by the training organisation.
- English and maths support, if required, provided by the training organisation. Traineeships last anything up to a maximum of 6 months with the content tailored to the needs of the business and the individual.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIPS

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WHAT IS A SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP?

Supported Internships are one year study programmes run by Plumpton College, with the core aim to find paid, sustainable work for young adults with SEND.

This is a real hands-on course where you'll spend at least one day a week in a working business, and the rest of your time either in college or working out in the community on a range of real-life projects. It's a brilliant opportunity for you to develop practical skills, you'll get to develop your existing skills and transfer them from the college environment to the workplace.

You'll be encouraged to look at the barriers that are preventing you from working independently, all with an end goal of finding a job to suit your aspirations.

You'll need to be 18 - 23 with an Education, Health and Care plan and be in your final year of college.

Alternatively if you do not have an Education, Health and Care plan, we can offer you a Supported Traineeship.

HIGHER EDUCATION

From 2018, many of our degrees are validated in partnership with The Royal Agricultural University, Cirencester, Together we give our students expert teaching, an inspirational campus and a rich student experience to ensure our graduates leave us career ready, with the right knowledge, skills and attributes to become the future leaders of the land based sector. We have degrees in Equine Science and Coaching, Veterinary Nursing, Animal Behaviour and Conservation and both Wine Production and Wine Business. For 2019 we have plans to develop an exciting new programme in Land Management. By studying with us at level 3, you will have the opportunity to progress onto studying with us or at the Royal Agricultural University for your degree. We offer students studying at level 3 specialist sessions and events throughout the year to prepare for this next exciting step.

ENGLISH & MATHS

STUDYING FOR ENGLISH & MATHS

We know that employers are looking for students with good English and maths skills and as it is our goal to help you be as employable as possible. We will work with you to improve your skills during your time here. We have a fabulous team of expert staff who have supported students over the last two years to exceed national averages in achieving their grade 4 and above in English and maths.

This is why we include English and mathematics results as part of our entry criteria for our study programmes, as all students who haven't yet achieved a grade 4 or above in their English or maths will continue to study it with us, either at GCSE or Functional skills level 1.

'I studied the level three gamekeeping course over two years at Plumpton and I developed my skills through a range of practical and theory tasks. Running the commercial shoot in my second year was such a great experience which gave me transferable skills for my career. Towards the end of the course I was applying for jobs with the help of my programme manager who had been in contact with Kevin at Sandringham. PLUMPTON CAMPUS

Nestled within the foothills of the South Downs, the estate is over 800 hectares. The site has outstanding facilities including a large American barn style stabling, outdoor and indoor riding schools, workshops, an Animal Management Centre and one of the largest commercial college farms in the South East.

NETHERFIELD CAMPUS

STANMER CAMPUS

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Stanmer is our beautiful, specialist horticultural centre, just on the outskirts of Brighton in the grounds of Stanmer Estate, which is a great location if you're looking to study in a practical environment. We've got superb outdoor working areas at Stanmer – extensive areas for growing crops and plants all year round, plus a fantastic palmhouse which houses ornamental plants and grows international food crops. Our excellent propagation facilities mean that you can gain hands-on experience of growing rare orchid species, working closely with Kew Gardens and the South Downs National Park.

The campus is undergoing redevelopment to be transformed into not only an outstanding training and education facility, but to become a leading visitor attraction for the South East, all within the Victorian Walled Garden complete with a shop selling Plumpton Estate produce and a café.

Getting to Stanmer is easy via the Brighton and Hove bus service. You can choose to take the number 78 bus that drops you outside. Alternatively, the 25 and 25X buses drop at the entrance to Stanmer Park Estate; a 15-minute walk away. Easy train access from Falmer station makes Stanmer accessible from Brighton and Lewes too.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS

- The loan system is similar to that currently operated within Higher Education by the Student Loans Company. Loans are not means tested and you won't be credit checked. Repayments do not start until you're earning over £25,000 after April 2016. To be eligible, you must be:
- Studying a full Level 3 or 4 course (Such as Access to HE courses, Diploma and Certificate courses)
- A resident in the UK for the past 3 years
