
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PLUMPTON COLLEGE

TRAVEL



PLUMPTON COLLEGE CAMPUS

The main campus is nestled at the foot of the South Downs, on the border of East and West Sussex, easily accessible by bike, bus, car or train.

BUS

We offer a wide-reaching college bus network, from Worthing, Hastings, Eastbourne and East Grinstead, enabling access from surrounding areas. To help make travelling to college as affordable as possible, each year the college subsidises around 50% of the cost of all tickets. There are also two public bus services which will bring you to college.

TRAIN

Alternatively take the train to the main local stations; Lewes, Hassocks, Plumpton and Wivelsfield, and then connect with the college bus network the remainder of the journey. Discounted student travel is available via a UNIZONE season ticket which is exclusive to students in the Brighton or Worthing area; you'll enjoy unlimited travel by train.



CAR

There's plenty of free parking available to all.

BIKE OR WALKING

Plumpton College is 2 miles from Plumpton, the nearest train station.

Did you know we are just 12 miles from Brighton? With excellent shopping facilities, a beach and nightlife, there is something for everyone.

STANMER CAMPUS

The horticulture centre of excellence is within Stanmer Park and easily accessible by all modes of transport.



PUBLIC BUS SERVICES

You can reach the campus easily via the extensive network of public buses in and around the Brighton area.

TRAIN

The nearest station is Falmer, where you can walk or cycle through Stanmer Park to the campus. (Approx 30 minutes walking time).

You can use the discounted student travel, UNIZONE, a season ticket exclusive to students in the Brighton or Worthing area, to enjoy unlimited travel by train.

CAR

Car parking is free for students during term-time, however please note availability is limited.

This is a beautiful campus to reach either by bike or walking. If you are on foot, allow approximately 15 minutes from arriving at Stanmer Park to reach the campus.

ACTION YOUR POTENTIAL


Action Your Potential is a supportive organisation that works with Plumpton College. It offers our students incredible 1:1s, workshops, videos, resources and a programme of family webinars.

FURTHER EDUCATION AT PLUMPTON COLLEGE

We offer students the opportunity to study their passion and to learn and earn qualifications in a subject where their interests lie, enabling them to turn that into a career. This can be through our Level 1, 2 and 3 courses, (Level 3 is equivalent to 3 A Levels), or through our Foundation Learning or Apprenticeships programmes. Courses prepare students for a career pathway that can lead directly to work or further study.

STUDENT SUPPORT

At college there is a wide range of support available to our students, delivered by our experienced staff and trusted external partners. There is a person and department available for all of their health, wellbeing and safeguarding needs. We provide access to health advice, an independent counselling service and our own comprehensive wellbeing programme.

LEARNING SUPPORT

We pride ourselves on being inclusive, we are here to help and guide our students, monitor their progress and work with them to achieve their goals. Our Inclusive Learning and Development Team are able to guide students with a range of learning difficulties. We have experienced and qualified learning support assistants, teachers, key learning mentors, communicators and assessors who are committed to offering the support required.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

When looking to take the first steps into further education, finance can be a pretty daunting subject. We have put together a handy guide that focuses on the costs involved and the support available to you. Students can book a meeting with our Finance Department for 1:1 guidance. We have bursary funds that are given on a discretionary basis to provide financial assistance to eligible students who, without support, would not have access to learning. Support is targeted to those most in need, therefore we consider all awards on an individual basis and in a variety of formats.

TRAVEL

The college is in a rural setting on the border of East and West Sussex, which is accessible by bus, bike, car or train. Students can use the wide-reaching college bus service coming in from areas such as Hastings, Eastbourne, Worthing, Redhill, East Grinstead and Tunbridge Wells. Subsidised bus ticket bursaries can be applied for, ranging from 25-100%. The three nearest train stations are Plumpton. Lewes and Wivelsfield and students can pick up a college bus from here. The UNIZONE season ticket offers discounted train travel for students travelling from Eastbourne. Seaford and Worthing.

COME AND SEE FOR YOURSELF

There are a number of opportunities to visit the campus, to meet and talk with us, find out more and ask questions. We have Information Events throughout the year affording the opportunity for you and your young person to visit the campus and experience the facilities available. 





THE RIGHT QUALIFICATION FOR YOU

APPRENTICESHIPS

Apprenticeships provide an opportunity to develop your skills, knowledge and behaviours in your chosen profession via practical and theoretical training while in paid, full time employment.

Apprenticeships are open to anyone who is 16 years old and over, has a right to work in England and is not in full time education. There is no upper age limit, and are available to anyone, whether starting out in their career or for those who have been working for some time. Modern apprenticeships can now support your learning aspirations to the highest level, with the level of apprenticeship based on the job role and its duties.

As an apprentice you'll usually be employed to work a minimum 30 hours per week and be paid a wage no less than the current national minimum wage for the time you are in work and training. At least 20% of your paid time will be spent in training and development. usually with us at Plumpton College but may also take place online or in your workplace. The rest of your time will be spent applying your skills and knowledge in your workplace, doing the job you have been employed to do. By the end of your apprenticeship, you'll have gained the skills and knowledge needed to either succeed in your chosen career or progress onto the next apprenticeship level.

FULL TIME STUDY PROGRAMMES

Our full time vocational programmes are accredited by a range of different awarding organisations, including Pearson Edexcel, City & Guilds and Gateway. All of the courses that can be studied at Plumpton College, enable students to achieve technical qualifications, which means that students develop industry knowledge, skills and competences alongside a programme of academic study. All of the courses are assessed via coursework, and many now also include written exams and other time constrained assessments.

QUALIFICATION LEVELS

Entry Level: If you have no prior experience and you don't feel confident about your abilities, then this level could be a good place to start. You do not need any qualifications but you will need to show a willingness to learn.

LEVEL 1: Ideal if you are just starting out or are new to the subject area. This level covers routine tasks and basic knowledge.

LEVEL 2: This is a great way to improve your knowledge of a subject area and will be the equivalent of GCSE level of study.

LEVEL 3: You can either study for one or two years to attain either an equivalent to one full A Level or the equivalent of three A Levels. Ideal if you would like to go on to study at a higher level, such as a degree qualification.

EDUCATION PATHWAYS & FOUNDATION LEARNING

A dedicated provision for Electively Home Educated (EHE), Schools and SEND Learners, providing individualised programmes tailored to prepare you for further study or work. There are no formal qualifications required to join this provision. All you need is a desire to learn.

14+ STUDY PROGRAMMES

For school students aged 14-16, school Years 10 and 11. We offer a one-day a week provision. School students can come to college and study for a vocational qualification, one-day a week for either one or two years. This is a great stepping stone into our full time provisions.

Applications for this provision need to be made by the school.

ELECTIVELY HOME EDUCATED LEARNERS

Our programmes are based on a one, two or three-day pathway, which is built around the individual learner's educational requirements:

- One day offer (option 1): Vocational only.
- Two day offer (option 1): Vocational day plus English and maths (GCSE or Functional Skill).
- Two day offer (option 2): Vocational x 2 days.
- Three day offer (option 1): Vocational day plus English, maths, science and Aspire (PSHE).
- Three day offer (option 2): Vocational x 2 days plus English and maths.

The Vocational offer includes:

- Agriculture
- Gateway to Engineering (Motor Vehicle)
- Sport and Adventure Education
- Animal Care
- Horse Care Equine
- Floristry
- Horticulture
- Blacksmithing / Metalsmithing
- Woodland and Forestry Skills

FOUNDATION PROGRAMMES (SEND)

Our Foundation Learning courses at Entry 2, Entry 3 and Level 1 offer learners individualised programmes to grow their personal and social development, communication and study skills, and include work experience to develop those all-important employability skills. These programmes include vocational qualifications and embedded English and maths. The Supported Internship is a year-long programme with the core aim of assisting learners in finding sustainable. paid work through a robust curriculum of employability skills and work experience.

All of our programmes follow a RARPAbased delivery model (Recognising and Recording Progress and Achievement) where learner progress is measured continually throughout the year on individualised targets that relate to the outcomes stated on their Education, Health and Care Plan (if applicable).

If you're aged 16-18 on 31st August in the year when you start your full time course, then there are NO course tuition fees payable.

For full time students aged 19 or over on 31st August in the year when you start your course, there will be tuition fees. The fees payable are dependent on the course you are studying.

Fee remission (i.e. the Government pays the tuition fee and exams fee) is available to students that meet the following criteria:

- Students aged 19+ unemployed and in receipt of JSA (Jobseekers Allowance) or Work-Related ESA (Employment Support Allowance) or Universal Credit (UC) - FREE up to and including Level 2 courses.
- Students aged 19+ unemployed and in receipt of a means-tested state benefit looking to enter employment - FREE up to and including Level 2 courses.
- Students aged 19+ employed, or self-employed, who are looking to upskill and their gross annual salary is less the £17,374 - FREE up to and including Level 2 courses.
- Students aged 19-23 who enrol on their first full Level 2 course - FREE.
- Students aged 19-23 who enrol on their first full Level 3 course - FREE.
- Students aged 24+ who enrol on their first full Level 3 National Skills Funded course (contact Enquires for the list of courses) - FREE.

£17,004.00* may be entitled to fee remission.

If you're being supported by your employer or a sponsor, you'll need to provide a letter of authorisation at enrolment.

Tuition fees vary based on your programme of study. These fees do not include college facilities, materials and assessment fees which will be charged separately. You can apply for a loan via the Advanced Learner Loan scheme to pay your course fee.

BURSARIES

We have a wide range of bursary funds that are given on a discretionary basis to provide financial assistance to eligible students who would not have access to learning without support. The threshold household income for a discretionary bursary is £27,000. We also consider applications for residential bursaries to help with your costs of our on-site accommodation, if you're in a household with an income below £34,000 you can apply. We consider applications for support on an individual basis. We advise early application for financial support as these funds are limited. You can apply via our website.

PAYMENT PLANS

We offer deferred payment schemes, where you can pay fees in equal instalments during the academic year. To find out if this applies to you please contact finance@plumpton.ac.uk or call 01273 890454. ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS

The loan system is similar to that currently operated within higher education by the Student Loans Company. Loans are not means tested and there is no credit check.

Repayments do not start until you're earning over £26,575 a year. To be eligible you must be:

- Studying a qualifying Level 3 or 4 course such as Access to HE courses, Diploma and Certificate courses.
- A resident in the UK for the past 3 years.

MATERIALS & CONSUMABLE FEES

Where courses require material/ consumables which are essential to complete your study, this will be included in the price of your course fees or, if your course is fully funded, this will be included in the funding. This will apply to all students, regardless of their fee assessment.
